



News From the Circle Meeting

It is always good to gather with other Federation of Christian Ministries members, and the February Circle meeting was no exception!

On Thursday evening, our group welcomed new and first time in-person Circle members and guests, and checked in with one another. On Friday and Saturday, we worked hard discussing, debating, asking questions, and making decisions for the present and the future. Much of the weekend, we laughed and enjoyed each other's company.

Some of the decisions the Circle made included:

- Appointed president-elect Tom Cusack as president for the remainder of president Ron Davis' term.
- Approved 6 candidates for commissioning
- Approved 4 candidates for endorsement
- · Created a committee to recommend an improved process for orienting new members and engaging current members in FCM
- Approved the recommendation by the Endowment Committee to raise the distribution percentage to 35% from 10% of the Annual Accumulated Appreciation. Note: only the earnings (Appreciation) can be distributed. The principal (donations) will continue to be invested in order to yield earnings.
- Appointed Tracy Peterson to the endowment committee.
- Changed the Commissioning Chair position to the Background Check Coordinator position, a non-Circle position.

Work to be followed up in subsequent meetings includes:

- Volunteers needed for the following appointed positions:
- o Secretary (term expires 7/2023)
- o Newsletter Co-Editor (one co-editor is resigning)
- o 2024 National Assembly Committee we have 2 members; and need at least 2-3 more.
- o Ethics Committee members (terms expires 7/2023)

(Please email chairperson@fcmmail.org if you are interested in serving in one of these positions.)

- We continue to lament the number of members who do not renew within the specified timeframe.
- We had a significant discussion around Who We Are as FCM. There is significant concern that the statement on the website does not convey or reflect members' experiences of FCM. A less technical and more wholistic statement is being drafted. Stay tuned for more updates.

New Things

Hello FCM, again. I am honored and surprised to take on the responsibilities of Presidency of FCM five months before my term was to begin in July. Despite this surprise, I love this job and I love FCM. So, I am getting into the mix right away.

I met the Circle of Directors members in Chicago at the Circle meeting there. This is a dedicated and dynamic group of people, leading FCM. My thanks to the veteran members with their experiences and to the new members, who are bringing new insights to FCM leadership. The discussions at the Circle meeting are already moving into projects that will affect all of us in FCM.

One new committee is delving into questions of how we in FCM describe ourselves to the public. Words are important as they convey our reality to others. This committee's work is essential at a time of rapid societal evolution. I am confident that the outcomes and decisions flowing from this committee will be of great benefit to us.

A second committee is looking at the ways in which FCM as an institution brings onboard new members (or not) and generates involvement as new members settle into FCM. I believe that this committee's work will have a very positive effect on our cohesion as a faith community. A community requires interaction between its members. We can grow this interaction going forward.

A third committee is working to develop a structured plan of training and support for our new vice presidents. The critical position of vice president is the front-line position for FCM as an organization. Mentoring by experienced members of new vice presidents will be emphasized. Written materials about the operations of FCM and its history will be reviewed. The programs developed by this committee will be ongoing and over time will enlarge so more members become familiar with FCM leadership positions.

Old Things

I believe a critical aspect of our community's endeavors is our focus on growing spiritually. I see a necessary part of our FCM work as the personal involvement of each member in their prayer and meditation lives. I recommend structured time to you all for prayer and meditation. I also ask you to carve out some time to attend the FCM Prayer Gathering which occurs every Thursday evening at 8 PM EST. The Prayer Gathering is always led by an FCM member who brings their spiritual expression to the fore. It is always inspirational. Please plan to join the Prayer Gathering at least on a quarterly basis to dip into the ongoing spirituality of FCM and its members.

Finally, please pray for FCM daily along this line: 2 x 2 4 FCM. This little formula can be read as, "two minutes of prayer and two minutes of meditation for the benefit of FCM." With this spiritual generator humming every day through our entire membership, FCM's future will be assured as a glowing example of the presence of Christ among us.

A History of our Permanent Endowment Fund

How far we have come!

TOM STRICKER

We began the discussion about having an Endowment in 2016. When the Circle voted to start an endowment, our first job was to raise more than \$10,000. This was the amount required to start an account with Vanguard. In 2017 we started collecting donations and by 2018 we had the funds to begin. Here is our annual account of the monies we raised.

Year	Donation Amount
2017/2018	\$13,110.00
2019	\$23,839.00
2020	\$14,930.00
2021	\$34,350.00
2022	\$26,560.00

In just the first five years of Our Permanent Endowment Fund, we have received \$112,789 in donations.

We now have a total of \$121,306 in OUR FCM Permanent Endowment Fund!

We have not lost any of our donations, even with the difficult times we have all faced in the Market. For this I credit Tom Cusack's wise investments.

Our Permanent Endowment Fund Committee is pleased to announce that the following change in the Permanent Endowment Policy was voted by the Circle and passed with a 11-2 vote to change the percentage of Accumulated Appreciation distribution from 10% to 35%.

We, the FCM Permanent Endowment Committee, encourage everyone to become a "Sustaining Member" by becoming a monthly donor. You can start with a \$5 or \$10 monthly donation. If we could get 300 of our members (only 50% of membership) to donate \$5.00 a month, that would result in \$18,000 of income for our FCM Permanent Endowment Fund.

In a number of past newsletters you've gotten a glimpse into the ministry of a number of FCM faith communities. In this issue, I'll try to answer the questions, "What are FCM faith communities?" and "How can I be part of a faith community of FCM?".

What are FCM Faith Communities?

Faith Communities of FCM are defined by the Biblical concept that "where two or more are gathered in Christ's name, God is present." (Matthew 8:20) The FCM Constitution states "like the early Christian communities, we believe that the people of God, whenever and wherever they gather, are church."

All types of FCM Faith Communities join in our common mission of inclusive ministries. In addition, these communities embrace FCM's core values of Belonging, Compassion, Empowerment, Equity, and Mindful Living. FCM Faith Communities are people coming together to find common ground for common good, to grow spiritually, to be inspired, and to be of service to one another and others.

This definition is intentionally broad to include people who choose to gather in unique, non-traditional ways, for a variety of purposes, and a multitude of beliefs. We, the members of FCM, are people dedicated to living out our common mission of responding to the Divine Call by empowering and nurturing those inspired for inclusive ministries. Our faith communities should reflect that common mission.

Being Part of a Faith Community of FCM

You can become a member of an existing faith community. Currently, faith communities are located across the country. You may find a community in your area that meets in person. Some of these communities meet in person and online, while others meet only online.

If you have people in your life who have moved away from traditional churches but are looking for meaningful ways to find spiritual nurturing as well as to connect with others, you might consider creating a community. Size doesn't matter in becoming a faith community of FCM. This type of small faith community is often called a House Church.

God Opened Another Door

My ministry has been with the dying for many years. Although hesitant to retire, I heard a soft inner voice telling me to do so. Working with patients at a cancer wellness center partially filled the void after retirement, but that ministry was not the same.

So, I was excited to hear of a comfort care home for the indigent scheduled to be built entirely by donation in Akron. We needed this support for the terminally ill who are alone or without adequate or safe housing.

That care home, **Grace House Akron** was built and is now thriving. This comfort home is grounded in the knowing that there are too many underserved individuals in our community at the end of their life with nowhere to go or without adequate care. Grace House staff administers medication provided by the hospice involved with the resident, and volunteers fill all other roles.


A care home is not a new idea but greatly needed. Chaplains volunteer to sit in vigil with the dying, offer support to the resident and family and to celebrate birthdays. Even pets are welcomed and provide love and support. A cat lovingly cares for patients and staff.

If this story stirs your heart, see if there is a comfort care home near you. Omegahomenetwork.org has a listing of many comfort care homes across the country where you may volunteer.

As one care home resident said, "It just means that God looks after everyone."

FCM Registry

New Process for FCM Sacramental Registry

A new process for the FCM Sacramental Registry which is used for Baptisms and Weddings. The Sacramental Registry will now be accessed through Realm. Steps to access the Sacramental Registry can be found below.

Members will complete a separate entry for each Baptism or Wedding.

As a reminder- All FCM members presiding at Baptisms must register the Baptism with FCM. We encourage you to register Weddings through the FCM registry in addition to following any state and local process required for your area.

Accessing the Sacramental Registry

- Go to www.onrealm.org
- · Log into your Realm profile using your email address and password you created
- · Find and click on the "Events" tab on the left-hand side
- Find and click on the "FCM Baptismal Registry (2023)" or the "FCM Marriage Registry (2023)" event
- Click on the "Register By (Date)" button
- On the right hand side you will see a note that shows Who is attending this event?".
 - Ensure your name is checked and click "Next"
- Complete as much information as possible ensuring to enter informatio for all required fields indicated with a red *
- Scroll back up to top right hand and click "Next"
- Review your information for accuracy
- Click on "Register" button
- · Repeat process if you have other sacraments to register

Published book explains the important role of interfaith education in alleviating violent extremism in Kenya and the rest of the world

'Burying the Sword' by Gerald Grudzen is set for a new marketing campaign

SAN JOSE, Calif., Feb. 2, 2023 /PRNewswire-PRWeb/ -- Following their time in Nairobi to take part in a major interfaith program, Gerald Grudzen and his wife also met Judy Walter, his wife's life-long friend who is a Maryknoll Lay Missioner working in the largest slum of Mombasa (aka Bangladesh). While they were there, they learned of the interfaith conflict resulting from the incursion of Al Shabab terrorists infiltrating the coastal region of Kenya. Grudzen was asked to give a talk to the Coast Interfaith Council of Clerics on the importance of interfaith dialogue between Christians and Muslims. The chairman of the council asked him to raise money for interfaith education programs in the Mombasa region and he was able to raise funds to start what became a decade long series of education program in Kenya.

Set for a new marketing campaign, "Burying the Sword" (published by AuthorHouse in February 2017) analyzes the historical and political context in which various forms of violent extremism (jihadism) have emerged in the Middle East, Europe, and in Africa since the 911 attacks. Grudzen believes the growth of the jihadism can be attributed in part to the oppressive regimes of the Middle East, which have curtailed the democratic impulses of their youth. For him, alternative youth movements can serve as a source of inspiration and model for renewal of these regions.

This book also analyzes the role that technology can play in organizing future youth movements and serve as part of an interfaith educational program that has already been initiated in Kenya. Furthermore, Grudzen stresses the need for new models of interfaith education in public and private school throughout Africa to counteract the growth of extremist ideologies among the youth of this region.

"There is no other book of which I am aware that provides the historical background to conflicts between the two largest monotheistic religions and provides and provides a path forward to improving relations between through interfaith education. This book shares a possible solution to religious and political fundamentalism," Grudzen says. When asked what he wants readers to take away from the book, he answered, "Christians and Muslims can collaborate to build a harmonious society in diverse parts of the world."

The international interfaith conference titled "Walking Together in the Light of Fratelli Tutti and Laudato Si" co-sponsored by Global Ministries University(GMU), The Institute for Interreligious Dialogue and Islamic Studies at Tangaza University (IRDIS) and the Harmony Institute of Kenya in alliance with the UN World Interfaith Harmony week will be held on Feb. 2-4, 2023.

Grudzen is the president of Global Ministries University, which established the interfaith education program in Kenya featured in this book. Visit globalministriesuniversity.org/.


Gerald Grudzen teaches
