

Many of us deeply feel the divisiveness of our time. We long to have bridge-building conversations about polarizing issues and yet when we try, we end up frustrated, angry, and wondering how "they" (whoever "they" are) can possibly believe what they believe, say what they're saying, support who or what they support. Not knowing how to navigate these conversations is particularly painful when "they" are people we love.

Those of us are charged with community care (churches, organizations, groups) may feel hesitant to host such conversations because we want to hold all in care and are afraid that discussing "hot" issues will only widen gaps between people holding different perspectives and experiences. We long for tools to cultivate trust and create more courageous spaces for honest conversation.

- > What are ways to maintain connection so that all parties have a chance to speak honestly and be heard?
- > How do we move from "us" and "them" to a greater sense of shared vision?
- How do we cultivate these spaces in a way that acknowledges the ways privilege and power affect such conversations?
- How do we move toward conversations that aim for win-win rather than win-lose?

This two-part workshop introduces the Nonviolent/Compassionate Communication (NVC) framework to explore strategies for finding connection across divides, while standing firmly in our own values and integrity.

Part 1, Communicating Across Divides, includes:

- A brief outline of the NVC framework
- Introduction of strategies for maintaining connection with self and others
- Modeling of the practices
- Time to practice the strategies in small groups and receive feedback

### Part 2, Facilitating Across Divides, includes:

- Introduction of additional skills and strategies for facilitating group conversations
- · Time to practice the strategies in small groups and receive feedback
- Discussion of how to take these tools and strategies beyond the workshop

Both parts of the workshop are participatory with an emphasis on **practice**. You will be invited into the vulnerable space of reflection, discussion, and experimentation through role plays.



### Workshop Facilitator:

Cory Lockhart is a teacher, artist, writer, public speaker, and peacemaker. She facilitates classes and workshops for teens and adults on living and communicating with compassion and speaks to groups about the experiences and ideas that have shaped her. She believes in the fundamental dignity of every person and the interconnectedness of all people and Creation.

Cory has been an adjunct professor at Bellarmine University and teacher at <u>Drepung Gomang Center for Engaging Compassion</u>; she was the primary writer of the <u>CrossRoads Ministry</u> program <u>Seeking the Shalom of the City: Revisiting and Re-visioning Louisville</u>, wrote the 8-week program <u>Cultivating Nonviolence</u>, <u>Harvesting Peace</u> for JustFaith Ministries, and has an ongoing commitment with <u>Christian Peacemaker Teams</u>. In April 2016 in Rome, she was one of about 80 participants in the <u>Nonviolence and Just Peace conference</u>, organized by the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace, Pax Christi International, and other organizations. # So You Want to Be a Lospital Chaplain?

Hospital chaplaincy is an important and rewarding ministry. But, hospital chaplaincy is also misunderstood, both in terms of what it entails, and what kind of preparation is needed to be an effective, qualified chaplain.

Hospital chaplaincy is interfaith ministry in a multicultural setting. Chaplains provide spiritual and emotional support for all the people they serve, whether or not those persons are religious. A chaplain's focus is to support patients and hospital staff in finding their own meaning and sources of strength. Chaplains do not proselytize, evangelize, or in other ways impose their own viewpoints on others. They do open themselves to the faith, beliefs, and life stories of others, as they accompany them through their suffering and meaning-making.

Many times, applicants for staff chaplain positions must be Board Certified (or Board Eligible) in order to be hired. It is important for chaplains to research which credentials are required and accepted at the hospital in the part of the country where they apply, because it will vary. Ordinarily, Board Certification requires at least four units of accredited Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) and a Masters of Divinity (or equivalent) degree. This may sound like a lot of alphabet soup! However, learning the different acronyms for certifying bodies is important for anyone seeking to become a hospital chaplain.

I am an ACPE (Association of Clinical Pastoral Care) Certified Educator. I am also an APC (Association of Professional Chaplains) Board Certified chaplain. I manage CPE for the West Florida Division of AdventHealth. Our CPE center is accredited by the Association of Clinical Pastoral Education. I love teaching and working with chaplain students in their learning process, especially those who are preparing for board certification as professional chaplains.

Accredited programs of CPE are fundamental in preparing students for professional chaplaincy. CPE not only provides clinical training, it also engages students in learning about themselves the ways in which they have been shaped by their families of origin and faith traditions, as well as by significant events and relationships in life. They learn to examine their assumptions and biases, which is the only way to change them. They learn about the importance of culture and cultural humility. All of this intense work helps chaplains become more open to the experiences of others they serve in ministry, without allowing themselves to get in the way.

Both the experience of CPE and life as a hospital chaplain can be tremendously rewarding. It is important for those embarking on this path to do the important work of making sure they get what they need to become successfully employed. As an educator, I have the long-range hope of preparing others well for hospital chaplaincy, I also know the immediate need for people to find the right kind of training programs as they begin their chaplaincy journey.

# Endorsement for Specialized Ministries

Qualified FCM members may apply for "Religious Body Endorsement" for the specialized ministries of Chaplaincy. Pastoral Counseling, and Clinical Pastoral Education. Such endorsement is required by professional certifying organizations and many institutional employers. The FCM Circle of Directors acts on endorsement applications three times yearly. 
