In my local faith community, we used Parker Palmer's 40-Day Journey as our prayer focus. On Day 5, Palmer states that humans "not only take physical abundance and make it scarcity, but we do the same with the infinite supply of goods of the Spirit." If you agree with this statement, why do you think it is true? Perhaps it's our way of protecting ourselves. Perhaps it's the way we have experienced the world and know no other way.

Our recent cycle of baby formula shortages and increased prices for gas and other items is also accentuated with hate, violence, impatience, and lack of self-control. In other words, a shortage of the fruit of the Spirit. It is my prayer that we'll feel the fresh dose of the Spirit poured out lavishly during Pentecost.

Fresh from the May Zoom Circle meeting, I am filled with gratitude and can say resoundingly, FCM does not have a scarcity of the "goods of the Spirit." I am grateful that, unlike some faith communities that were forced to close permanently, you, our members have been faithful. We have nearly 600 active members and many have given generously to FCM's Endowment fund. I am grateful that FCM continues to gain new members who want to serve others. I'm grateful we continue to ordain and commission exceptional members, to elect persons to serve on the Circle of Directors, and this year, for the first time, we were able to award grants to some of the ministries of our members! I am also grateful that FCM continues to gather, and some of us will gather in person this year for the first time since 2018/19. These are Spirit-filled actions.

FCM's Mission, Vision, and Values reflect the fruit of the Spirit. As I observe what other faith communities are doing, many have gone back to in-person gatherings. However, many, if not most, continue to offer digital options as well. A digital offering is a way of being inclusive. It's a way to include those who, geographically, would not be able to participate. It's a way of including those who, for whatever reason, choose not to participate in person. FCM's challenge is to create the same welcoming sense of belonging and inclusion digitally and to continue to facilitate ways for those who wish to gather in-person to do so between Assemblies.

This work doesn't only belong to the Circle. As always, we need more members to volunteer. What role is the Spirit leading you to serve in FCM?

New Living Translation of the Bible

Today, as I reflect on living though a pandemic (two years of no Federation of Christian Ministries National Assemblies and very few gatherings), I'm wondering how this Bible verse should inform our practice. God knows, there are times when we must be careful.

When I was younger and a congregational pastor, it was difficult for me to look out and see an empty pew - or two or three pews. Believe me, people are creatures of habit, and pastors know who sits in each and every pew in the sanctuary. I could look to the left of the pulpit, and I knew the families who sat on that side of the church. There were other families and individuals who always sat to the back of the sanctuary. There were some individuals who always arrived ten minutes late. It was impossible for them to slip in unnoticed. Yeah, I knew who was at home too

I have talked to some of the leaders in our faith communities. They tell me that once the lockdown ended, when they opened the doors for in-person worship, it took time for people to come back to church. They said that some people became used to doing other things on Sunday mornings. They've said that some new people now worship with them on Sundays and throughout the week. Our leaders have shared they also have a core group who has stayed with them through all the challenges and joys during these challenging two years. In many ways, they tell me that their faith communities are finding a new normal.

I'm praying that FCM, at a national level, will find its new normal. In July, we will have our first National Assembly in two years. I've been going to FCM's national assemblies since 2010. The first one I attended was in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. What I remember most about that time was meeting FCM members from across the country. The program was great, yet, what I remember most was meeting people, sharing laughter, life stories, and food together over the weekend. That time strengthened my relationship with FCM and our people. Those people have become my FCM friends and family. That's priceless.

To me, this our most basic and important mission as spiritual organizations and the most basic priority in our lives. Whether you join us virtually or in person, as FCM, we must meet and grow together in love and grace.

I truly hope to see you at the National Assembly this month: July 15th – 17th.

We at FCM offer our deepest sympathy to FCM member Pat Stubenbort and her daughters Cheryl and Danielle and to all of us who mourn the passing of our long time friend and fellow member, Paul Stubenbort. Paul joined FCM in January 1999.

Paul's Obituary

Paul J. Stubenbort passed away on June 25, 2022. Born September 23,1931 of Joseph and Mercedes Stubenbort in Pittsburgh, PA.

He attended the Franciscan Seminary in Oak Brook, III, and was ordained a priest in 1958. Paul received graduate degrees in English and German from St. Bonaventure and Georgetown Universities and was a Fulbright Scholar in Germany before returning to teach at the seminary in Illinois.

In 1970, he left the Franciscans and married Patricia Tringali. Paul and Patricia met in Bonn, Germany where Patricia worked at the U.S. Embassy and where Paul was Catholic Chaplain. He and Patricia moved to Pennsylvania and had two daughters, Cheryl and Danielle.

Paul continued his professional work in education, teaching German in several public schools, serving on the Bensalem Township School Board, and eventually retiring from Hopewell Valley High School.

Paul's special joy was the time he spent with Patricia, Cheryl and Danielle. Paul and Pat coached their daughters in softball and soccer, spent years finding hiking trails and climbing mountains, especially the White Mountains, the Blue Ridge, the Smokies and even the Alaska Range.

After retirement, Paul and Patricia traveled for ten years, beginning with two summers in Alaska, where Paul gave tours at Denali National Park. In addition to his travels, he worked to provide inclusive ministry to all of God's people through Federation of Christian Ministries, Dignity Philadelphia and Call to Action.

Paul and Pat were Vice Presidents of the Northeast Region of The Federation of Christian Ministries 2009-2015. They also were chairpersons for the FCM Assembly celebrating the 45th. Anniversary of FCM.

Paul always thanked God for another day, a good long life and the wonderful people he was able to share it with.

Preceding Paul in passing were his parents, his brother Joseph and his sister Marcia.

Succeeding Paul is his beloved wife Patricia, his wonderful daughters Cheryl Synowiec and Danielle Foster, his grandchildren Madison, Timothy, Blaise and Marisol, who brought such joy to his life, his sons-in-law Michael and Brian Robert and his sisters Dolores McMahon and Andrea Clavin, who will miss him dearly.




Honorary and Memorial Giving

Aware: God, Others, Self

AWARE: God, Others, Self

I am revisiting the concept of awareness of God, others and self. Here are some of the results.

I intentionally practice a specific way of being aware of God. I have the image of a satellite dish sitting on my head, like a fascinator hat. It is continually tuned into the God channel. (I do hope you're laughing now.) It works for me! I am reminded to ask and look for God's help and direction.



One day at the hospital, I visited a Muslim patient and her daughter. Concerned about connecting well, I tuned in to my imaginary satellite dish to be aware of God. As I entered the room, I remembered Hagar. The three of us reflected on this woman who met "The God Who Sees Me" and whose tears brought water to the Zamzam Well near Mecca. We connected on a deep level united by our womanhood, belief in the God of miracles and Hagar. All thanks to satellite-on-the-head awareness.

I usually feel like an unwelcome outsider. I am aware that others may feel the same. This awareness allows me to look beyond self to others and offer hospitality and welcome.



One day I was called to the emergency trauma room to be with a patient who was having a heart attack. As I entered the room, I observed three family members wearing identical black t-shirts sitting stiffly in a row like a

second wall. I greeted them as I walked to the head of the patient's bed. As I spoke to them, I became aware that they were afraid to approach the bed. This was a new experience for them – fortunately. I was in this room in these situations daily. I invited them to come gather around the bed. As I spoke to the patient, they began to speak to her and touch her. The awareness of their feelings allowed me to offer welcome in and gave them the gift of connecting with the woman they loved in this fear-filled, strange environment. Hospitality - Hospital + ity.

Self-awareness is difficult for me. I was driving to work and feeling angry. As I stopped at a light, I asked myself, "Why are you so mad?" As I reflected, I realized I was stressed because in the process of transitioning from one hospice company to another I was covering both companies. Acknowledging that I express stress in anger, I identified and observed my thoughts and chose new ones.

One thing that helps me is the practice of objectively observing my thoughts, taught by Deepak Chopra on my Fitbit app. I ask, "I wonder what my next thought will be?" Waiting for it creates space for quiet. When the next thought comes, I decide whether or not to engage it.

Another source of help is the writings of the Apostle Paul in Philippians 4:8-12

8 Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. 9 Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

I am empowered to choose my thoughts. Objective observance and choice of thoughts help me to be self-aware and recover peace.

I hope sharing my reflection and practice of awareness of God, others and self encourages you in your practices. I would love to hear your thoughts and practices, if you would like to share them.



Healing Family Connections in a Post-Covid World

The magnitude of this recent global health crisis has left many of us feeling disempowered and has affected every aspect of our lives: our health, our jobs, our financial situation, and even our personal freedom to come and go as we please, how we spend our time and who we get to spend it with.

I cannot remember a time when I have felt more disconnected from people in general and from some of my loved ones in particular. I am not referring to the physical distance, but rather to the disconnect coming from strong opposing views that emerged along with this deadly virus.

Our family, like so many others, was traumatized not only by the pandemic, but also by the ensuing unhealthy family dynamics caused by questions over the validity of this health threat and many of the government mandates that followed.

For healing of these relationships to begin, we must come to terms with the fundamentally different convictions we hold about the reality of this global threat and how these convictions have shaped our individual experiences.

Now that we have regained a sense of safety, we can perhaps take time to not only share our own truth, but engage in information sharing that conveys our openness to respect those who have convictions different from our own.

The words and actions of our loved ones may have left deep scars in our hearts. The path forward may require that we practice forgiveness. When we forgive, we release ourselves from the burden of bitterness and make room for reconciliation. Or perhaps we are the ones needing to make amends. We might begin softening our hearts by recognizing that we are not an expert on anyone else's path. What is right and true for me today may not be so for others. Only time will reveal the true impact of our pandemic-related decisions.

What matters today is that we come back together as families, as a local community, and as citizens of this country to do our part in transforming this trauma into hope for our future.

Here they are in their own words:



"After finishing my M.Div. at Princeton Theological Seminary, I now work at the Manhattan VA- NY Harbor Health Care System as the Palliative Care Chaplain. My ministry is with veterans that are coping with life-limiting illnesses or are near the end of life. I provide spiritual and emotional support to my patients, as well as their families and our staff. My primary ministry is to sit with someone in their suffering and help them speak their truth. I was drawn to FCM because of its openness and Catholic history. I felt it allowed me to be me, while supporting my ministry at the VA." (Melanie Cicalese)



"I am an LGBTQ and Mental Health advocate, and I serve as a full-time Staff Chaplain at NYP Brooklyn Methodist Hospital. I received my M.Div. from Union Theological Seminary in NYC and am pursuing an M.S.W. degree at Touro University in NYC. I have been called to walk with patients and their families through their end of life, and I am also deeply engaged in providing mental health care practices. My walk with God through my life experiences has led me to identify to a Queer Womanist Theology of community which undergirds all of the care I provide. I was introduced to FCM through my supervisor and spiritual partner, Joo Young Hong, and it has been a blessing. The sheer fact that I can use words like LGBTQ and Queer in a public space provide a testament to the ministry that FCM is doing, and I am thankful to grow in ministry with all of you." (Q. "I am a recent M.Div. graduate (Chaplaincy Tract) of Moravian Theological Seminary in Bethlehem, PA. Although raised in the church, chaplaincy was a new and inspiring ministry for me. I hope one day to be a Hospice Chaplain. I was introduced to FCM by my friend and FCM peer, Frank Shipman. FCM has become my second chance to serve God and serve others. I will be able to administer the sacraments. How blessed is that? This fall I begin a full-time CPE residency at St. Luke's Hospital in Bethlehem. FCM has become a place of healing for me and a community of those who have remained true to their calling.
